A mistake can be self-corrected, but errors can not. Mistakes are manifest in slip of the tongue, random ungrammaticalities and other performance lapse that are common to both native speakers

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and second language speakers. Errors are 'systematic,' i.e. likely to occur repeatedly and not recognized by the learner.
