Joan became the official cartographer of the Dutch East India Company. Around

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1649 he published a collection of Dutch city maps entitled Tooneel der Steeden (Theater of Cities). In 1651 he was voted into the Amsterdam council. In 1654 he published the first atlas of Scotland. In 1662 he reissued the atlas in 11 volumes, known as the Atlas Maior.

The underlying principles were the same throughout (including the 'Atlas Maior'): a lavishly coloured title-page, often more or less heightened with gold; a functional colouring of the maps and a contrasting, more extensive treatment of the map decorations.

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
