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Stanhope and Lancaster (2008) define vulnerable populations as "those defined at a greater risk for poor health status and health care access"(p.712). The role of a public health nurse in contrast to a vulnerable population is to establish interventions to help break the cycle of vulnerability thus aiding to eliminate health disparities within the population.

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Collecting assessment data on the physical environment includes what is often referred to as a "windshield survey" (Anderson & McFarlane, 1988; Stanhope & Lancaster, 2008). The windshield survey reflects what one can view from a car window as one drives through a community and contains observations of various components of the community ...

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Stanhope and Lancaster (2008) states: "The community is the client only when the nursing focus is on the collective or common good of the population instead of on individual health" (pg. 44) and "Although the nurse may work with individuals, families or other interacting groups, aggregates, or institutions, or within a population, the resulting changes are intended to affect the whole community" (Stanhope and Lancaster, 2008, pg. 344).

Experiential Community Health Assessment Through PechaKucha

Stanhope & Lancaster (2008) explain that people in a phenomenological community “have a group perspective that differentiate them from other groups”. The members of this community share similar characteristics, goals, ideas, religion, race, values, or beliefs. Community health nurses provide care to culturally diverse people.
